
## **KEYBOARD SHORTCUTS**

Whether you are using a MAC or a PC the shortcuts are the same. The key is to remember which command to use.

The MAC uses the Command Feature



The PC uses the Control Feature



Both instruments use the same keystrokes as shown below

MAC-KEYBOARD SHORTCUTS	PC-KEYBOARD SHORTCUTS
COMMAND-A=SELECT ALL	CTRL A=SELECT ALL
COMMAND-B= <b>BOLD</b>	CTRL-B= <b>BOLD</b>
COMMAND-C= <b>COPY</b>	CTRL C=COPY
COMMAND-D=SELECT FONT	CTRL D= <b>SELECT FONT</b>
COMMAND- D=SELECT FONT	CTRL D= <b>SELECT FONT</b>
COMMAND-N= <b>NEW</b>	CTRL N= <b>NEW</b>
COMMAND-O= <b>OPEN</b>	CTRL O= <b>OPEN</b>
COMMAND-P- <b>PRINT</b>	CTRL P- <b>PRINT</b>
COMMAND-Q= <b>QUIT</b>	CTRL Q= <b>QUIT</b>
COMMAND-S= <b>SAVE</b>	CTRL S= <b>SAVE</b>
COMMAND-T= <b>TAB</b>	CTRL T= <b>TAB</b>
COMMAND-U= <b>UNDERLINE</b>	CTRL U= <b>UNDERLINE</b>
COMMAND-V= <b>PASTE</b>	CTRL V= <b>PASTE</b>
COMMAND-X= <b>CUT</b>	CTRL X= <b>CUT</b>
COMMAND-Z- <b>UNDO</b>	CTRL Z- <b>UNDO</b>

Printing your screen on a MAC and PC is different too. The commands for that are as follows:

MAC-Printing Screen Directions	PC Printing Screen Directions
<b>Command Shift #3</b> -Captures entire	Print Screen Button-Click
screen	
<b>Command Shift #4</b> Only captures	
that image
